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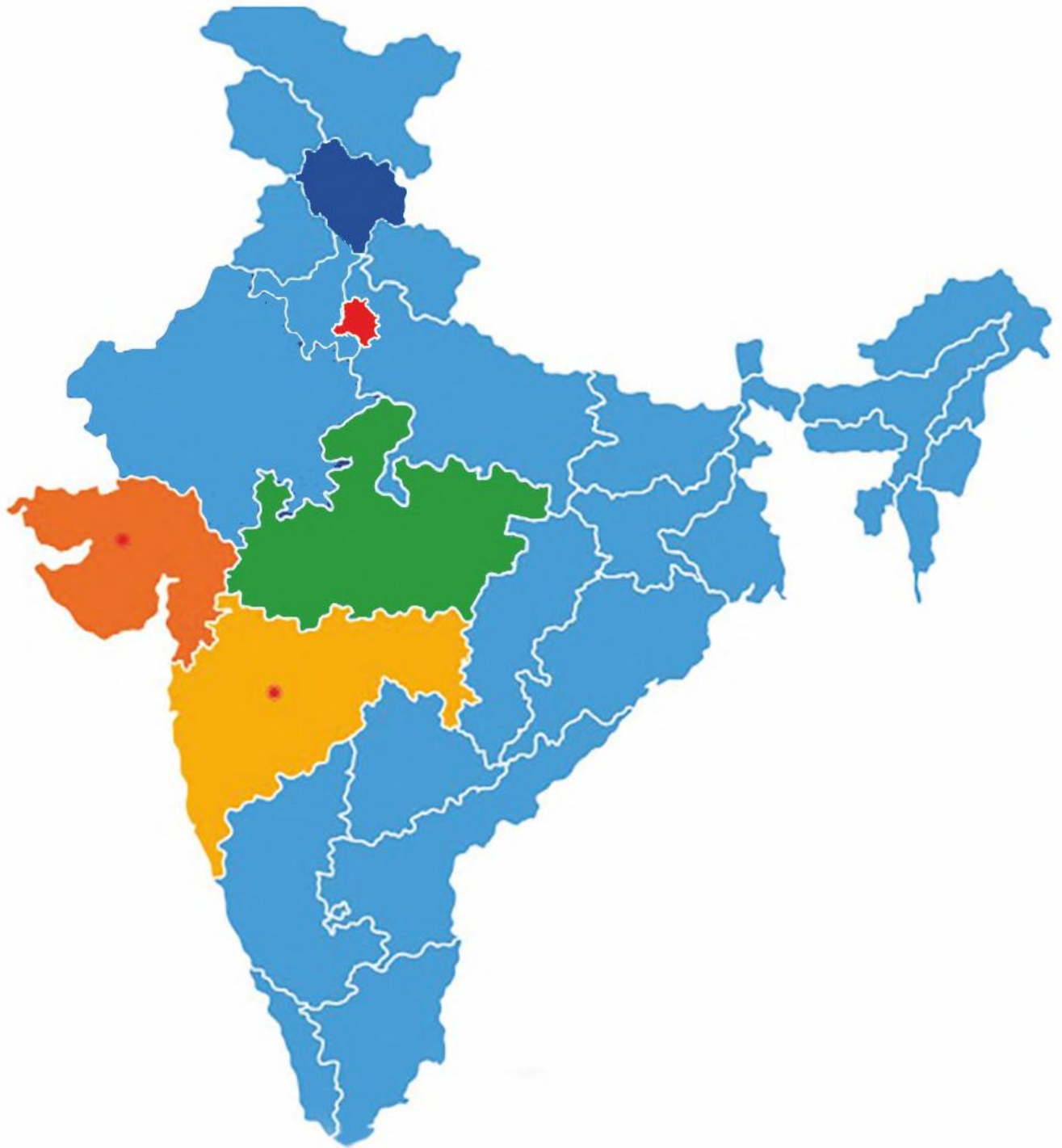

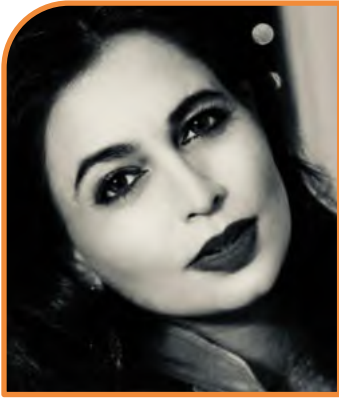

As I reflect on the Cosmo Foundation legacy, I am extremely proud of the impact of our work. When we started 15 years back, we had a vision of inclusive development, of caring for the lesser fortunate and giving them access to equal opportunities for growth and development. Harnessing the collective power and potentiality of all stakeholders, we have experimented and scaled innovative initiatives over the years. This wealth of grassroots knowledge acquired puts us in an all the more responsible position to dream big and deliver bigger.

This year has been special for CF on several counts. Firstly, we completed 15 years of our existence. And in a way we are proud of it. The growth of our programmatic interventions, geographical coverage and consequently the number of people that we have been able to impact has exponentially multiplied over the years. We expanded from one location in Gujarat to Maharashtra, Delhi, HP and MP over the years and reached out to 62,000 children and 6,50,000 community members.

Over a decade long work in Gujarat, it was like a 'laboratory' to us, where we learnt, unlearnt and gained the confidence to spread our wings. The human capacities that were built here became the first line leaders in our expansion plans enabling us to grow without compromising on quality.

And lastly, this has been a year of receiving unprecedented recognition from all corners. The passion that we as a team share for our work and the smiles it brings on the faces for whom we work is our true reward. Yet with great humility under my command, I do acknowledge that being recognized with awards and accolades at the state and national level gives us immense motivation to continue doing the good work with greater zeal! The introduction of rainwater harvesting systems in 11 government schools of Gujarat has been another important step towards our water mission. This year, some interesting projects to empower the vulnerable, especially women through creating livelihood opportunities have also taken shape.

All the work we have been able to do would not have been possible without the grassroot leadership that we have been able to nurture over the years. This talent pool from within the community has been instrumental in our progression as a foundation. They have become role models for their communities.

The recognition that has come our way in the form of awards is truly a team effort. 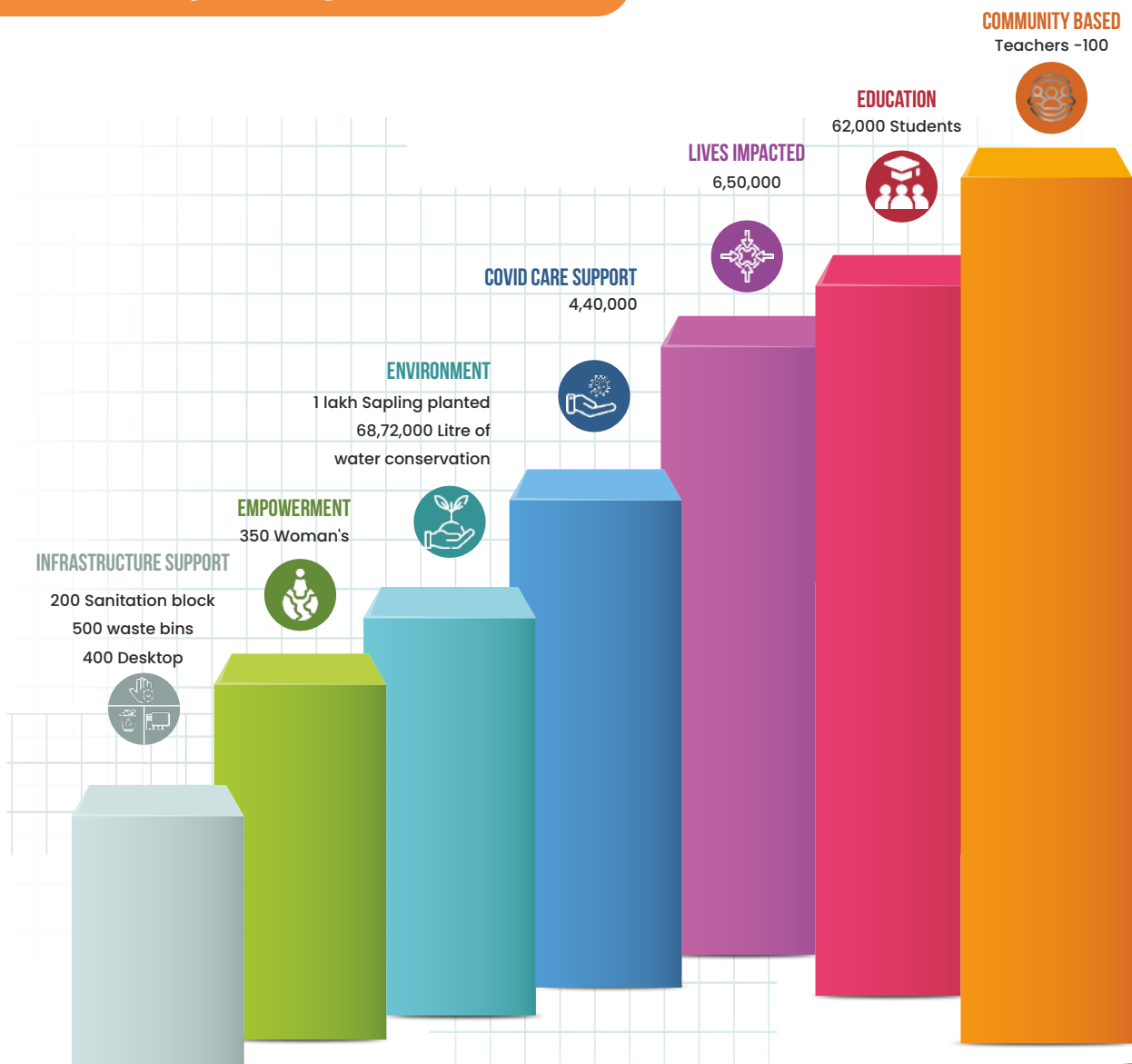

GENDER RATIO - KARJAN



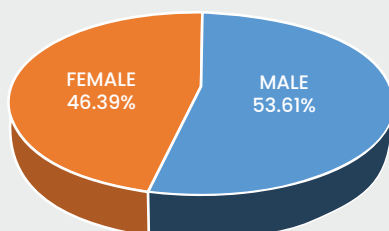

DIVERSITY RATIO - KARJAN



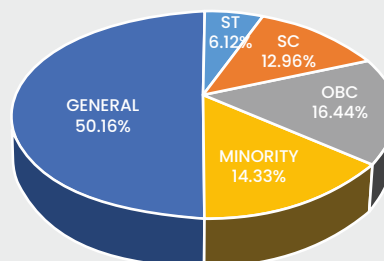

Thus, born 3 E's, as our guiding principle under which all our programs and projects are clubbed for a well-organized structure to our work.

EDUCATION: Igniting minds....brightening lives

Education can be the key differentiator in a person's life. It is a basic right of each citizen. Understanding the issues that lead to disparity in quality education for underprivileged and rural children, CF designed a holistic program to reduce the learning gap and equip them with essential life skills and confidence to cope with academics and become future-ready. The three-pillar program consists of the following components.

Provides basic computer and digital operation skills to children and youth

The dark looming shadows of Covid-19 finally seemed to be behind us. We forged ahead with greater zeal and enthusiasm in our commitment to bridge the educational and digital rural-urban divide through our 3 flagship programs and innumerable innovations and modifications to adapt to the changing times.

Resumption of offline classes



This entire year, all our classes functioned uninterruptedly in the offline mode. The difference from last year was that children were to a large extent adjusted to the routine, rigor and discipline of regular school as compared to last year. All our efforts to address the challenges of significant learning gaps, child labor, lack of interest in studies and school absenteeism bore fruit this year. Through constructive dialogues with students and parents, study skill sessions, and rewards and recognitions by our specially trained CF teachers, we were able to witness a 30-70% surge in student attendance. Likewise, the results of students too showed a marked improvement.

Expanding our Horizons



The demand to initiate CF classes from schools and villages is testimony to the appreciation our work is receiving at the grassroots. We expand our wings to 4 more schools and villages, with 2 CGVKs and 2 computer labs in villages of Karjan. Under Nipun Bharat program of government, stressing on foundational literacy, these CGVK classes were initiated with extra coaching hours. At village Ambelohal in Aurangabad district with a predominantly Muslim population, a CGVK class in Urdu language was started. Thus, we are able to reach out to 900 + more children and impacting the lives of students and youth.

Foundational Literacy, Numeracy and Life Skills Program (CGVK program)



It is a matter of great pride for us that our constantly evolving 15-year-old flagship program, has all the tenets of the New Education Policy. Our emphasis, from the very inception of the program was on activity based and experiential learning, ensuring foundational and numeracy skills to be able to cope up with studies and practical life situations. Today, the NEP has recognized these as formidable to improving the quality of education. The half yearly evaluations show that 58% students have achieved reading, writing and basic calculation proficiency. A proof of our success is the requests that we have received from 25 new schools to launch the program.

- 58.8% students from Aurangabad and Karjan have been upgraded to the next level, having acquired fluency in reading, writing and number calculations.
- A significant impact as compared to assessments of last two years is the drop-in absenteeism rate from 12% to 4%, which can be attributed to the successful child engagement strategy post Covid.
- Government school teachers believe that students who attend the CGVK program are able to cope with school curriculum much better. Post Covid, these students have been able to bridge the learning gap more easily as compared to non CGVK students.
- Qualitative assessments show an increased levels of confidence in children.

Special Recognition

Ms. Ankita Patel, cluster coordinator of CGVK received the first prize in a story telling competition 'Kunjostav' in Vadodara.

Hiral Solanki, a CGVK student was conferred the first position in a Story Telling Competition organized by District Panchayat, Vadodara



Two months back, CF started the CGVK program in Koliyad village of Karjan. Manav Vasava, a child studying in std. 1, was very passive and inactive in class. He could not respond to any question asked by the teacher. CF Balmitra built rapport with him, gave him individual attention and identified his interest areas. She engaged with him, especially for Maths and Gujarati subjects only through games and activity-based learning. Over a span of time, his confidence improved, and he started responding in class. His performance in the oral annual assessment was remarkable!

Having acquired basic numeracy skills and alphabet recognition as well as oral speaking ability, his teacher is confident about him getting into mainstream education very soon!

Special Coaching for Competitive Exams



Accommodating the demands of parents and students, CGVK ventured further to impart special coaching to students desirous to appear in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya entrance exams- a CBSE free-of-cost residential school set up by the Government of India for talented rural students. With the help of special tutors, systematic coaching of 300 students was done in advanced math's, logic, and geometry. It is a matter of immense pride for us that 6 children cleared the exams and got enrolled in these schools.

Computer Operation & Digital Skill Building

This has been the most popular program amongst rural children and youth. Computer and digital skills are key to explore and compete in this technologically and digitally advanced world. Over the years, we have seen our students perform well in higher studies as well as their careers with the confidence they acquire owing to these skills. Today, we reach out to the rural population with 24 computer labs in Karjan and Aurangabad villages.

Revamping of Computer Labs in Rural Government Schools



CF set up 4 new computer labs and upgraded 21 others with 300 computers having cutting-edge technology such as Windows 11 and other latest tools. It is a valuable step towards empowering children with the latest technological skill sets necessary for higher education and future employability. The upgraded computer labs have enhanced children's enthusiasm to learn newer skills through exploration. It has also helped foster their creativity.

The year-end assessment done delineated some remarkable achievements.

- 63%** → Upgraded to next level
- 51%** → Completed the course
- 36%** → Able to use MS Word, MS Excel, PowerPoint, Paint etc. effectively
- 90%** → Have learnt WPS office with smartphone applications
- 60%** → Are able to use online platforms such as Google Meet, zoom etc.
- 70%** → Can surf the internet
- 75%** → Can use social media actively
- 35%** → Have embraced digital payment methods
- 65%** → desire to learn coding and 15% have been exposed to languages like C,C++

- It is noteworthy that admissions to rural government schools in Aurangabad district has increased by 20% due to the initiation/upgradation of computer labs.
- There is an improvement in academic performance too as around 35% children use computer labs to access e-learning materials and resources, science projects etc.

- Hybrid learning through Digi Pathshala has helped improve the quality of education imparted by CGVK as well as rural government schools
- Maximum participation of students in art and craft activities, English, General Knowledge, debates etc. have been observed.
- CF outreach has increased two-fold through this platform. The biggest advantage is that even where our formal English program is not operational, children have acquired good communication and writing skills through participation in Digi Pathshala.
- The visibility and credibility of CF has increased exponentially as many children enrolled in the Digi Pathshala platform. They are also from schools where CF has not been able to reach through its regular programs.
- 85% of students have acquired the knowledge of new technologies and the use of mobile apps, google forms, you tube channels for their education.

Basic English Learning Program

This year, the program was initiated in 4 more schools of Aurangabad, thus reaching out to 368 children.



Cosmo English Tutor – Online Platform for Learning English

An online portal to learn Basic English communication, developed by CF last year, has gained tremendous momentum. Learners from diverse backgrounds and locations are engaged, which includes students, teachers, jobseekers, working people, homemakers etc. The Unique salient feature of the initiative is the vernacular language medium of instruction. The success with Gujarati language instructions encouraged us to prepare content in the Marathi language to reach to a wider and diverse audience. The content preparation is underway and will be launched soon, benefitting the Marathi speaking populations.



- CF outreach and visibility has increased through the Cosmo English Tutor– Online platform
- 1642 users are enrolled with a total of 24715 video viewership so far. YouTube Subscribers 453, Views : 5,902

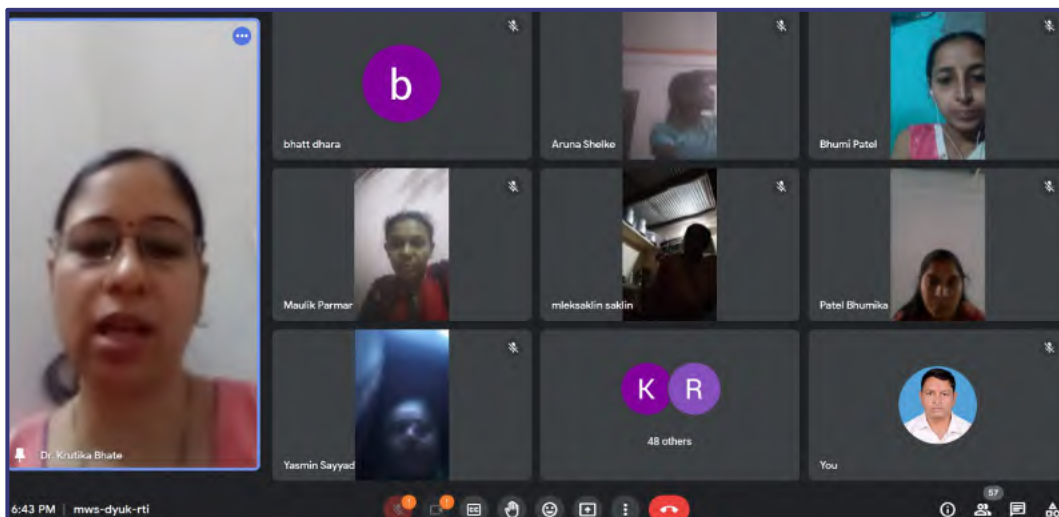
International Women's day

A series of activities were planned based on the UN theme of 'Embrace Equity'. More than 15 women employees from the manufacturing divisions of Karjan and Aurangabad visited rural schools where CF is operational and motivated children with their inspiring journeys from school to university and as employees. On behalf of Cosmo First, the contribution of Balmitras and teachers in sculpting the lives of children was acknowledged and were felicitated with gifts.



Capacity building workshops

'Digit-all - Innovation and Technology for Gender Equity' was organized for all teachers and Balmitras of Karjan and Aurangabad. Today, women are underrepresented in the technology sector. Enhancement of digital skills would boost their growth and productivity. Thus, in association with the Department of Extension and Communication, MSU Vadodara, a Webinar was held focusing on easy to use technology in daily life.



At the behest of the Indian government, UN declared 2003 as the 'International Year of Millets'. To spread awareness regarding their significance and benefits and increase the production and consumption of millets, Karjan Municipality organized events such as cooking competitions, rallies, street plays etc. CF actively participated in these events and contributed to the noble cause.



World Consumer Rights Day

Rural children were taken to local retailers where they obtained understanding regarding various facets such as importance of reading labels and descriptions properly, maximum retail price, difference between genuine and fake bills etc.



World Heritage Day

CF organized a campaign on the theme 'Know our Heritage, Preserve our Heritage' in villages Puri and Kagzi pura. Discussions, quizzes were held and students made beautiful paintings on the heritage of their village and surrounding areas.

Festivals such as Diwali, Holi, Ganesh Chaturthi and many more are all celebrated with fun and abandon with the underlying message of environmentally safe and resource conscious celebrations.



Celebrating life's exuberance with children in the summer camps

We engage the rural children constructively during the scorching summer months through summer camps. This has become a very popular annual celebration among children and parents alike. A plethora of activities such as art and craft, science experiments, pottery and sculpture, toy making, balloon and stone paintings, puppet making, best out of waste and music, dance, drama, sports are organized bringing out different facets of their personality. More than 370 children from 15 villages of Aurangabad and Karjan participated in the camps.

Environmental sustainability is a key priority at CF. Through diverse initiatives, we aim to promote biodiversity, facilitate sustainable water management, reduce soil erosion and pollution, save energy and increase carbon capture to name a few.

Nurturing the Green Cover...Agroforestry and Miyawaki

Last year with the technical support of Prayas Youth Foundation, CF planted a total of 55000 saplings planted. in different locations. It worked with 115 farmers of 23 villages in Aurangabad and Vadodra district to plant 40,000 fruit bearing saplings, covering about 132 acres of land along with 15,000 saplings by creating Miyawaki Forest. The project was envisaged with multiple benefits such as promoting a sustainable and green economy, optimal land utilization, pollution control, providing alternate green incomes to farmers as conventional farming is seasonal and inconsistent, etc.

Along with continuous handholding and monitoring of CF, local stakeholders' capacities were built to nurture and manage the plantations. It is heartening to record a 90% survival rate of all these plantations. The farmers have also started earning incomes from the fruit produce, which will multiply over the years. The green spread is expected to reduce 1197 tons of carbon and 61 tons of oxygen production annually.

- 90% survival rate of 55000 saplings planted agroforestry and Miyawaki in 200 acres of land, projected to reduce around 2000 tons of carbon and boost 61 tons of oxygen production annually
- Impacted environment as well as lives of 115 farmers in 23 villages of Aurangabad and Karjan
- Maintenance and cleanliness of gardens under the Karjan highway flyover and Aurangabad airport



Livelihood Restoration through Agroforestry

Salma, a marginal farmer from Fulshehra village in Aurangabad district was determined to raise her family income. With the help of CF and Prayas, she planted 500 sweet lemon trees on 1.5 acre farmland. Through trainings and handholding, and her own relentless hard work and care, all the lemon trees survived. They are growing really well. To ensure that the trees get enough water, she has undertaken the construction of a well and also plans to build farm ponds in the future. All her crops are chemical fertilizer free. She is hoping to have a good yield and fetch a good price too! She is thankful to CF for giving direction to her desire!



Development and Maintenance of Public Garden

Likewise, CF has been taking the responsibility of maintenance and cleanliness of gardens under the Karjan highway flyover as well as Aurangabad airport since more than a decade with the objective of increasing the flora and fauna and providing green lungs amidst pollution in cities.



Safe Drinking Water Facility

The root cause of many illnesses is non accessibility to safe drinking water. CF addressed this issue by creating drinking water facility. It includes underground water tanks in 2 rural schools of Maharashtra and RO facility in 2 Government schools of Himachal Pradesh in neighboring villages of the Cosmo Ferrites and RO water facility in Bal Vidya Vihar underground water tanks in two rural schools in HP and Maharashtra respectively benefitting 2000 students annually.



Donation of Recycled utility items

In an exemplary gesture, Cosmo First produced recycled utility items from BOPP and handed over 33000 items such as buckets, tumblers, containers etc. to CF, which in turn donated these to 430 institutions including Anganwadi, Mid-day Meal Centers, and Primary Health Centers, benefitting nearly 63000 people.



EMPOWERMENT...unlocking potentials, giving wings to dreams

Education as an empowering tool for underprivileged rural girls: Cosmo- Udayan Shalini Fellowship Program

Cosmo Foundation has partnered with Udayan Care since the past 5 years and implemented Cosmo Udayan Shalini Fellowship Program. 40 aspiring rural girls from most needy rural families of farm laborers, auto drivers, barbers and the likes are selected from Cosmo-affiliated villages of Gangapur block of Aurangabad District. The program provides scholarship, mentorship, and exposure to these Shalinis and empowers them to pursue higher education and employability. It enables girls to unlock their potential through meticulously designed workshops on communication and career awareness, English and Digital Skill Building, financial literacy, and marketing along with wellness and personality development. Senior employees of Cosmo First and their family members mentor these Shalinis and help them to build and nurture their aspirations.

The girls have not only achieved significant milestones in their respective academic disciplines but have also excelled in various social, educational, and technical domains. Many of these Shalinis are preparing for competitive exams to join Banking sector, Police, Army, as they strive to make a significant impact in nation-building.



Noteworthy interventions this year

- Participation of Shalinis in 'Career Mela' organized by – Udayan Shalini
- Workshop on 'Campus to Corporate' for 2nd for Shalinis on acquiring knowledge, appearing for interviews, work environment etc.
- Workshop on values, paper bag making, opening Bank account
- Mentor – Mentee Meet at village Gajgaon, Aurangabad where learning experiences were shared
- 76 Shalinis appeared for the National Aptitude Test, a remarkable achievement
- A Basic computer course introduced this year, enthusiastic participation of all Shalinis to hone their digital skills

Livelihood Opportunities to BPL families

COVID-19 has proven to be not only a health crisis, but also a livelihood crisis. Daily wage earners from Below Poverty Line families were most adversely affected. To foster income generation and empowerment among these families, Cosmo Foundation donated Push Carts to 31 Below Poverty Line families who lost their livelihoods in New Delhi.

Small scale ventures such as selling fruits, vegetables, tea and eateries have been started by the beneficiaries, grossing about 18-20k incomes per month. These sustainable incomes have saved families from the vicious cycle of poverty and hunger.





Cosmo Nari Swayampurna Program A step towards empowerment of tribal women with Livelihood Support

There is a vast tribal population in the Chhindwara district of Madhya Pradesh. Despite rich mineral and other natural resources as well as industries, these tribal inhabiting the hilly terrains live in abject poverty, agriculture being their primary source of income. Women are more vulnerable to discrimination and exploitation. Efforts are being made to improve the status of tribal and other marginalized communities in the district through various initiatives in health, education, livelihoods and awareness building by the government as well as several civil society organizations.

CF has partnered with a local civil society organization for this project, which aims to provide livelihood support to self-help groups of tribal women in seven blocks of Chhindwara District. Cosmo Foundation has carried out preliminary need assessment and will provide the necessary processing machines for Agarbatti making, Paper plate/bowls (Dona Patta) making, Millet Processing. 270 + women will get sustainable livelihood support. The expected monthly profit is around Rs. 5 Lakhs and Rs. 2000/- per woman/per month in initial phase. It will enable SHGs to start their enterprises. There is a huge potential for future growth, consequently enhancing the quality of life of tribal women and their families from most interior villages. The groups thus formed will also act as a support group for the women and instill confidence in them. The order for the machines has been placed and work will start as soon as the delivery is received.

Nari Ki Savari- A skill building initiative for urban marginalized women

In today's times, it is important to think unconventional and be fearless to be able to take charge of one's life. Thus, CF entered into a partnership with Shri Maharani Chimnabai Stree Udyogalaya, Vadodara which is one of the oldest women's vocational centers set up by royal Gaekwad family of Vadodara in the country, focusing on women upliftment and empowerment. We have partnered for a course – 'Nari ki Savari' to train women drivers, with the aim to create employment opportunity for women in non-conventional sector with dignity. In addition, training on grooming, self-defense, traffic rules etc. will be given.

CF will support 20 women in the pilot phase, and during the year, 60 such women will be trained. Linkages for their placements as cab drivers for schools and elderly, transport goods for big e-commerce companies and others have been worked out. Identification of women for the pilot has been done by CF. Bank linkages of the selected women has been completed, their uniforms finalized and readied. The project is set to start very soon. Through the project, it is expected that women would earn an average of Rs.15,000 per month.



Cosmo E-Service and E-Resource Station

This service was started in four villages of Karjan with the aim to make digital services available free of cost to the villagers, empowering them to avail these services without incurring time and wage loss as well as being abreast of the latest technological and digital developments. This year, another such center was initiated in village Handod thus having their presence in 5 villages at present. Some such services offered are:

- Online admission forms filling
- Seeing online results of various education courses
- Voters list (name corrections etc.)
- Referring e-library (for knowledge on different subjects)
- Payment of various bills and booking of services like gas cylinders etc.

- E- farmer portal
- Provident Fund registration service
- E- Information about government schemes (widows, disabled etc)
- Online applications for jobs
- Learning driving license preparation
- Online appointment for driving license
- E-forms for education scholarships



The Center is run by Cosmo teachers, with the help of Cosmo Computer students! This is a unique experiment where bright students are given an opportunity to apply their knowledge to the service of the villagers. So far more than 3000 villagers have availed these services.

- In the current year, 1565 villagers procured basic entitlement documents like - Aadhar cards, PAN cards, electricity bills, admission forms, E-Shram cards etc. at their doorstep free of cost.
- 90 rural students applied for online/ competitive exams, scholarships utilizing these services
- Several village youth and students took advantage of the e-resources, study material that are made available at these centers.

Awareness and Behavior Change

Knowledge is power. True everlasting change can happen only when there is a mindset and behavior change. Instilling the right values and habits in children at this tender age can ensure sustenance of our development efforts. Awareness building on various topics is inbuilt in our educational approach itself. Our efforts are not only restricted to children, but encompass village communities as well. Rallies, competitions, seminars/webinars are held throughout the calendar year, especially on special days.

Community Awareness campaigns on safe sanitation and hygiene practices, oral, menstrual hygiene, dental checkup, breastfeeding, breast cancer, epilepsy, lung diseases etc.



A session on – How to save and nurture soil, water and natural resources with students on the occasion of World Earth Day. Students did plantation in waste bottles, pots and showed sensitivity to plant saplings by utilizing local resources



All festivals like Holi, Diwali, Ganesh Chaturthi, Christmas etc. are celebrated across rural schools in an eco-friendly manner without wastage of any natural resources



The importance of saving energy resources, electricity was emphasized through poster competition on the theme on the occasion of World Electricity day.

CF organized drawing competition on the theme of "Save & Preserve Rain Water" across schools, inculcating the importance of rain water harvesting on National Water Day.

On Global Handwashing day, a session on the importance and correct methods of regular hand washing were organized and students took a pledge to adopt correct hygiene practice in their daily life.



Financial literacy training for students by ICICI Foundation



CF students raised awareness about cycling and its positive impact on health and mental wellbeing with fun and enjoyment



CF has worked tirelessly to raise awareness about safe sanitation and hygiene practices. Not restricting to just the construction of toilets, CF has ensured to put maintenance systems in place, making the staff and children responsible for the cleanliness of the toilets. It is heartening to see that while children's, especially girls attendance has improved remarkably and incidences of illnesses have reduced, 50% of the schools have deployed 'Safai Sevaks' for regular toilet cleaning.



To promote hygiene practices amongst rural students, CF distributed 254 green mattresses in 15 schools of Karjan for mid-day meals covering 2342 students. In addition, housekeeping materials for maintenance of school sanitation blocks and classrooms were distributed in 17 schools of Karjan and Aurangabad, benefitting 7203 students.



CAPACITY BUILDING ...Crafting Change Enablers – Leaders at the Grassroots

Leadership is the capacity to translate vision into reality. And capacities is the nurturing of an indomitable will to bring about change. Thus, we are highly committed to building the capacities of our most valuable resources, the backbone of all our interventions. Since education is the most skillful human resource intensive program, and had been our flagship one, all our employees are groomed as community teachers.



A well planned training schedule for teachers and Balmitras is organized throughout the year. More than 128 capacity building sessions, in-house as well as with the help of knowledge partners, were organized this year. While there are training and up-skilling sessions on the individual programs such as computer literacy, English, foundational literacy, the focus is also on broadening their vision and honing their knowledge through a range of topics, enabling them to handle children with love and care. We have ensured that through study circles and webinars, teachers and Balmitras of different operational areas share and learn from each other's contexts and challenges.

Likewise, parents form another important pillar in the overall development of the children. Engagement with parents has been ensured through regular parents meetings, seminars/ webinars on various topics. More than 24 interactions through all the above means and with parents have been held where more than 1200 parents enthusiastically participated. Door-to door HH visits were also conducted for rapport building and an understanding of the child's socio-economic and cultural setting.

- More than 128 capacity building sessions with CF teachers, Balmitras
- 10+ study circles of teachers and Balmitras across locations
- 24+ interactions with parents through regular parent meetings, seminars/ webinars
- Door-to-door community contact of 12000+ HHs covering 134 villages
- Enthusiastic Participation of 3000+ parents

Special Projects

Kagzipura– Support for A Model Heritage Village

A non-descript 700 year old town of Kagzipura near Aurangabad was once famous for its unique handmade paper mills. It has several heritage structures too. INTACH, in collaboration with CF and other partners aims to revive the handmade paper making craft upskill the artisans ensuring sustainable livelihoods, revive the water tanks and heritage buildings, beautify these places, thus bringing back the lost ecological balance and promoting it as an art and heritage tourist destination. CF is responsible for the environment, education and empowerment/community mobilization aspects of the model village.



◆ Model Heritage Village – Environment

CF supported the construction of a chemical free water filtration plant a washing ghat. 50 coconut trees were planted around the pond with security nets. Last year, the cleaning of pond which was undertaken has been maintained well.

The inaugurated washing ghat (Dhobi Ghat) is used by 60% of the villagers for their daily washing needs. The water treatment facility created ensures safe and clean water reaches back to the pond. Water pollution has seen a drastic reduction. Biological diversity has also improved. The deepening and cleaning of the pond has led to an increase in the number of fish and migratory birds, adding to the tourist attraction. It is also heartening to see a 99% survival rate of the coconut trees which add to the beauty of the pond.



◆ Model Heritage Village – Education

As part of holistic development, CF had initiated the Foundational Literacy and Numeracy skill class (CGVK) in this village government school last year with about 85 children. It is overwhelming to note that the student strength has today more than doubled to 180. The medium of instruction being Urdu and the activity based learning pedagogy has been received well by the children and parents alike.

Likewise, the Basic English and Computer literacy Programs have also seen tremendous response. In fact, there has been a 20% increase in school attendance due to the computer lab at school. Short term courses on MS Office, Design tools, resume making etc. offered by CF had 50+ village youth participate.



◆ Model Heritage Village – Empowerment

For any development initiative to be sustainable, the local communities' ownership is of paramount importance. It is only through appropriate mobilization approaches that stakeholder participation can be achieved. CF held a series of meetings with different stakeholder groups within the village to enlighten them as well as obtain understanding about the various issues of their village, its heritage status and the vision of its dying art revival. Forming village level committees with equal representation of women has enabled a vibrant and active role of the villagers in their development process. The cleaning and maintenance of the village, pond and washing ghat (Dhobi Ghat) as well as general awareness about relevant issues and stakeholder ownership has all been possible in a relatively small time.



Support to Bal Vidya Vihar– School for Underprivileged Children

Bal Vidhya Vihar, situated in Panchsheel Park, New Delhi, is a school dedicated to providing education to underprivileged students. To support their mission, CF generously donated RO water purifiers and coolers, while also renovated the restrooms to ensure the provision of hygienic facilities for students and teachers within the school premises. 250 students and teachers got an access to clean and safe drinking water as well as sanitation facilities. As a result of these impactful initiatives, there has been a notable increase in school attendance, with approximately 96% of students being able to resume their studies post-COVID. In the chilled winter of Delhi, CF donated jackets to the vulnerable children.



CF is in process to launch Computer Literacy Program and also engage capacity-building sessions with teachers, aiming to strengthen the foundation of language learning. CF did a demo session on the activity-based teaching-learning process, and how to make teaching more participatory and engaging with students. The programs are designed to equip students with improved subject knowledge, English communication skills, and enhanced cognitive abilities. They foster a participatory learning approach by integrating technology and community involvement. The teaching methodology employed by CF has received appreciation from the principal and teachers.



Mission Rural Health

The health of its people, especially women is a key determinant of the country's well-being index. At CF, in partnership with various private hospitals, schools and local bodies, massive health awareness camps are organized across villages in Karjan and Gangapur, ranging from awareness sessions on importance of nutrition and oral hygiene, prevention of common illnesses, menstrual and reproductive health, breastfeeding practices, critical illnesses like – pneumonia and epilepsy along with General Health, Eye, Gynae & Dental Check-ups. 30 % beneficiaries needed further treatment were referred to various hospitals and arranged medical care.

Around 15000 community members participated in more than 10 camps/ check-ups organized through the year.



Philanthropic support in chilled winter of Delhi

The challenges faced by the chilled winters of Delhi by the poor patients and their caregivers is heart wrenching. Empathizing with them, and providing some relief in their already troubled lives, CF in partnership with ISKCON distributed 4000 blankets and nutritious meals to patients and their caregivers at 5 prominent city hospitals. CF distributed 600 Electric Kettles and served 2000 ready-to-eat food to the inmates of National Institute of Tuberculosis and Respiratory Diseases with the support of ISKCON



VOLUNTEERISM: Encouraging empathy and experience exchange...Employee and Student Engagement

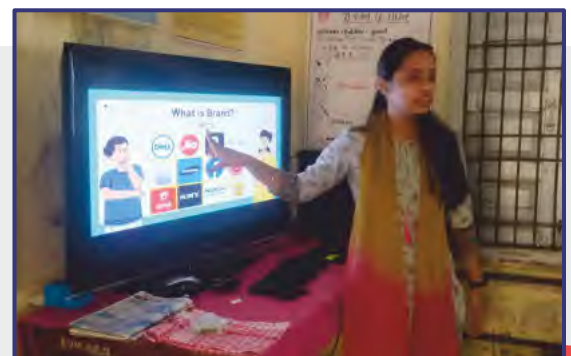

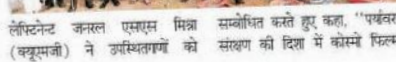

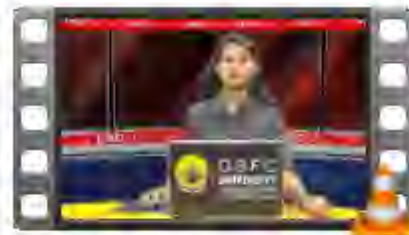
